Introduction

Thank you for partnering with Heartland National Life Insurance Company for Hospital Indemnity coverage. This Underwriting Guide has been designed to help you understand the underwriting process and guidelines in order to expedite the policy issuance process.

This guide contains a general overview and is subject to change at any time.

General Information

- **Eligibility:** Age 18-85. The age is determined as of the date the application was signed even if there is an age change before a policy is issued.
- In-Patient Benefit: If an applicant has a 93011 policy in force and is applying for the Secure Advantage Flex, the maximum inpatient benefit amount cannot exceed the daily maximum allowed in the state for both policies combined.
- Adding Cancer Rider: If an applicant has a 93011 policy in force and is applying for the Secure Advantage Flex with the cancer rider, the rider amount cannot exceed \$20,000 for both policies combined.
- **Policy Changes:** Any change to the policy benefits must be done within 30 days from the policy effective date. Any benefit change requested after the 30 day window will require a new application.
- Age of the Application: Applications must be received in the Home Office within 30 days of the date signed.
- **Application Date:** The application date MUST be the date the application was signed. Backdated applications will NOT be accepted.
- Effective Dates: Policy effective dates will usually be the application date. You may request effective dates
 up to 60 days past the application date (up to 90 days during AEP <u>only</u>). No backdating is allowed (i.e., the
 effective date can never be before the application date.)
- **Signature on the Application:** The agent must personally ask and record all answers to the application questions. No other person, including the spouse, may sign on behalf of an applicant. We do not accept Power of Attorney signatures.
- **C.O.D Business:** Heartland does not accept C.O.D business.

Tips for Completing an Application

It is important to complete the application in its entirety because it becomes the basis for the policy (which is a legal contract). If the applicant answers "yes" to any of the medical questions, the policy will be declined; do not submit the application.

If available in the applicant's state, the medical questions do not need to be answered if the applicant is between the ages of 64 % and 65 % as of the application date. However, if the cancer rider is applied for, the applicant must answer the medical questions for this rider regardless of age.

Always:

- Ask each question exactly as written (don't paraphrase).
- Record each answer exactly as given.
- Complete the application legibly and in black or blue ink.
- Have the applicant or applicants and agent sign and date the application.
- Have each applicant initial and date any corrections or mistakes.

- Use an additional sheet to record any pertinent information you feel would be helpful in evaluating the risk.
- Have the applicant sign and date any additional sheets.

Never:

- Use white-out or similar substances for corrections or mistakes
- Lead the applicant when they are responding to a question.
- Ask a general question (i.e. "Are you in good health?") and then answer all the medical questions on the application as "no".
- Complete an application by correspondence.
- Allow someone other than the applicant to answer the application questions.
- Answer questions with ditto marks (") or dashes (-).
- Answer questions with "N/A" (not applicable).
- Use abbreviations unless you are sure they are correct.

Replacement

If this policy is replacing any other accident and sickness insurance policy, record the policy number and company name on the application and then complete and include a Replacement Notice with the application. An insured cannot replace an active Cash Supplement policy with a new Secure Advantage Flex policy.

Submitting the Application

The following is required for the Secure Advantage Flex application:

- Application
- Initial Premium (including the application/policy fee)
 - o If applying jointly, only one application fee is required.
- Replacement form if replacing any accident and sickness insurance policy (if required in your state).
- Health Information Authorization (H-HHA17)

There may be other forms not listed above that are required in your state.


Premium Payments

Rather than submitting premium via a check with the application, an agent can request to draft the initial monthly premium in the Premium Payment section of the application. When this is selected, unless indicated otherwise, the first premium will be drafted when the policy is issued. Any payment submitted via check will be processed as EFT.

Bank drafts can be drawn between the 1st day and the 28th day of the month. For draft dates, "Draft Date" must be within 10 days of the effective. If the draft is more than 10 days from the initial premium, we will draft an additional payment in advance.

Rather than mailing an application, you can use three other methods to reduce time:

- 1. e-App via Agent Portal (www.heartlandagent.com)
- 2. Fax the application to 1-833-671-8870.
- 3. Use the **Upload Applications** feature on the Agent website. This is an easy-to-use feature that allows you to upload a copy of a scanned application.



Once we receive the application, it will be processed in the order in which it was received. If there are any errors on the application, you will be notified as they are found, and corrections will be requested. Any errors will need to be fixed before a policy can be issued.

Reinstatements

When a hospital indemnity policy has lapsed, and it is not within the grace period, the client will need to apply for a reinstatement of coverage where all underwriting requirements must be met before the policy can be reinstated. The underwriter will review:

- Application/medical history (current and previous applications)
- Claims history
- Cross reference policy claims analysis (review any claims history on other product lines).
- Payment history.

A prescription history check through Milliman is not required for reinstatement

Uninsurable Medications

If the applicant has taken any of the medication listed below in the past 2 years for the specific condition listed, do not submit the application. Applicants who have taken any of these medication for the related condition in the past 2 years are automatically declined.

Applicants who have taken any of these medications in the past 5 years are not eligible for the Lump Sum Cancer Rider.
